Europe is heading towards the goal of providing access to electronic patient data regardless of time and place and of networking different health care organizations and providers. The organizational and technical realizations (players involved, concepts, architectures, standards, etc.) differ from country to country, just as the present level of implementation. Scandinavian countries - especially Denmark - have gained a reputation for being at the very forefront of these developments. Austria, in turn, is currently in a process of catching up with these best practice regions - through its eHealth-Initiative and with regional telematic-strategies and -projects.

At this eHealth-benchmarking symposium, experts from various countries (Denmark, Germany, Italy and Austria) present eHealth-strategies, solutions for providing access to patient data and on-going EHR-projects and try to compare the various approaches and highlight future developments.

Furthermore, experts working on Europe-wide standards and strategies in terms of electronic patient summaries provide an insight into the present activities and status and try to compare different country-specific implementation strategies and concepts.
